Jewish films to be featured at festival

The Baton Rouge Jewish Film Festival kicks off Thursday, Jan. 17, with a showing of The Rape of Europa, a documentary that details the Nazis' theft of Europe's most treasured art. Following the film. Darius Spieth, assistant professor of art history at LSU, will lead a discussion on the film. The Rape of Europa starts at 7 p.m. at the Manship Theatre downtown, where several other acclaimed films and special events will be held through Sunday, Jan. 20.

On Saturday, Jan. 19, at 7 p.m., the festival will show a double feature—The Tribe and Blues by the Beach. The Tribe intermingles the histories of the Barbie doll and the Jewish peo-

ple. Blues By the Beach begins with a nightlife scene at a trendy Tel Aviv bar, but takes a shocking turn toward terror. Filmmaker Jack Baxter will speak after the film.

On Sunday, Jan. 20, audiences will be treated to a screening of A Jumpin' Night in the Garden of Eden at 2 p.m., followed by a performance by New Orleans' Panorama Jazz Band.

At 7 p.m., the festival concludes with Varian's War, which is based on the true story of American Varian Fry, who saved more than 2,000 people from the Nazis.
